### 2.0 Old Items

- 2.1 Approve Minutes from November 9, 2022 Meeting
  - 2.1.1 Motion to approve made by Brian Cook; seconded by Aubany Glancz

### 3.0 New Items

- 3.1 MAP data continued
  - 3.1.1 Mrs. Crowe reviewed Staton's winter MAP scores compared to CCSD scores
    - 3.1.1.1 Staton scored higher than the district average on RIT scores for winter MAP
  - 3.1.2 Reviewed projected proficiency on SBAC for math, reading, and science

- 3.1.3 Student Growth Summary Report reviewed
  - 3.1.3.1 Kindergarten and second grade well surpassed projected growth in math
  - 3.1.3.2 Kindergarten, second, and fourth grade met or surpassed projected growth in reading
  - 3.1.3.3 Third through fifth grade science student growth summary reviewed, 4th grade was 0.5 from projected growth
- 3.1.4 Mrs. Crowe reviewed grade level graphs showing student change between color bands based on MAP scores; the trend shows that students are not moving up color bands; for example, 4 students in the orange band in fall are still in the orange band in winter; teachers have been shown these graphs during PLC meetings

## 3.2 Grading Reform

- 3.2.1 Mrs. Crowe reviewed Pathway for Success grading reform presentation from CCSD
  - 3.2.1.1 Standards are set up such that students have all year to show proficiency with that standard
  - 3.2.1.2 This change provides opportunities for all students to succeed
  - 3.2.1.3 The balanced grading scale for kindergarten is 1 or 2, meets or approaches, respectively; grades 1-5 include the following scale 90-100% (A), 80-89% (B), 70-79% (C), 60-69% (D), 50-59% (F); specials and student behaviors are reported as E, S, or N
  - 3.2.1.4 Academic performance is the only factor included in student grades
- 3.2.2 Staton has deadlines to ensure accurate and timely grading practices: late work accepted by the following dates: 1/31, 3/10, 5/12
- 3.2.3 Reassessment must include opportunities for reflection, revision, and reassessment in order to ensure mastery of NVACS and district curriculum for all students
   3.2.3.1 Brian Cook asked if implementation of the reassessment policy was consistently implemented across Staton
- 3.2.4 Staton policy for retake available for students scoring below 90% on a summative assessment; can be requested by student or parent; request by parent should be completed in writing
- 3.2.5 Consistent grading categories across the district are set up as follows in Infinite Campus: Formative = 10%; Summative = 90%
