2.0 Old Items

- 2.1 Approve Minutes from November 9, 2022 Meeting
- 2.2 Motion made by B. Cook; seconded by A. Glancz

- 3.1 MAP data
 - 3.1.1 Preliminary data shared by K. Crowe (assessment window is still open in CCSD)
 - 3.1.2 Grade-Level Mean RIT = national mean RIT
 - 3.1.3 Mean RIT Score = Staton grade level mean RIT
 - 3.1.4 K. Crowe reviewed K-5 comparisons of national vs Staton mean RIT scores in reading and math
 - 3.1.4.1 Staton exceeds national mean RIT in all grade levels in both reading and math
 - 3.1.4.2 3-5 students take the science MAP assessment; Staton exceeded national average RIT in all three grade levels
 - 3.1.4.3 When the window closes, student growth can be evaluated and comparisons with district mean RIT scores will also be presented (January SOT meeting)

3.2 Instructional Rounds Data

- 3.2.1 Instructional round data shared by K. Crowe
 - 3.2.1.1 N/A on each graph of data presented means it was not observed during the brief time teachers were visiting the classroom
 - 3.2.1.2 DOK level observations split into K-2 data and 3-5 data (K-2 tasks are more common in the primary grades)
 - 3.2.1.2.1 J. Clemens added that additional professional development will be given to teachers on DOK level questioning and tasks to help improve in this area; K. Crowe told team that each teacher was given a DOK poster for reference and guidance when teaching
 - 3.2.1.3 Students using academic discourse clarified for team
 - 3.2.1.3.1 Procedures in place for productive struggle > what have teachers done to help students not consistently have to seek teacher help as their "go to"
 - 3.2.1.4 Tools for self-monitoring > how students know how their doing or monitor themselves
 - 3.2.1.5 Teacher facilitating instead of rescuing > J. Clemens clarified that the instructional rounds were 16 random classrooms for only a 15-minute snapshot of time
 - 3.2.1.6 Another set of instructional rounds will occur in January with different staff members chosen by each grade level
